Your assignment is to create a "mind map" that shows how you understand the events and causes that finally meant victory for the <u>allies!</u> Your mind maps will require you to annotate, connect, and draw visual representations of the causes and events that led to victory (both in the European and Pacific theater for the allies). Below is a list of events and causes that you must include. You will need to visualize the components and draw small illustrations that connect one idea leading to another. *Each component must have written descriptor explaining the significance of that component and connecting it to the main idea.*

Follow these steps to complete your mind map:


- 1. Begin by reviewing your notes on WWII
- 2. Make sure to include descriptors and dates (if appropriate)
- 3. Color all of your illustrations in neatly.
